

Camp Bayshore Families,

On behalf of Bayshore Christian School Administration and myself, we pray each of you are healthy and safe.

We are thrilled Camp Bayshore 2021 is set to open as scheduled; however, we will continue to comply with all guidelines and regulations set by the CDC and our local government. The safety and health of our campers, campers' families, and staff are of the utmost importance.

At this time and until further notice, the following guidelines and regulations will be applied to Camp Bayshore 2021:

- There will be a 14:2 camper/staff ratio for Minnows and Polliwogs and a 20:2 camper/staff ratio for Crickets and Bullfrogs. Each group will remain together throughout the day to alleviate any potential risk of cross contamination.
- We will be limiting the number of individuals on campus to only Bayshore Christian School and Camp Bayshore employees. Drop off and pick up will take place outside via a drive-thru procedure. Parents and/or any other adults will not be permitted to leave their vehicles. We will still require adults to present ID to confirm they are on the designated pick-up list before they can take a camper home. After registering, please login to your Parent Portal to ensure pick up information is current.
- With the current mask mandate in effect, masks will be required for all campers and staff at this point in time. While playing or eating outside, campers may remove masks.
- Before entering our campus, all campers' temperature will be taken daily with a non-contact forehead thermometer. If any camper has a fever of 100.4 or higher, they will not be permitted to attend.
- All children will be required to sanitize their hands upon arriving at Camp and throughout the day, specifically before and after they engage with any Camp Bayshore supplies.
- Camp Bayshore facilities will be cleaned and sanitized daily, as well as all supplies.
- Each group will have their own supplies to use during each week, so there will be no communal sharing.
- We are currently working to create a modified field trip schedule to comply with COVID-19 guidelines. More information will be forthcoming.
- All families must complete the COVID-19 form and submit all current physical and immunization records. This must be completed before a camper can attend Camp.
- If a child develops symptoms at Camp, they will be isolated and must be picked up immediately. Campers must have a physician's note to return and must be fever-free without the aid of medicine for 72 hours.
- If a camper is absent due to illness, a physician's note must be provided to return to Camp.
- If a camper has had an immediate exposure to COVID-19, the camper must quarantine for 10 days.

- If a camper or staff member tests positive, the CDC will be notified and has the right to close Camp for an average of 2 – 5 days or for its entirety.

While we hoped Camp Bayshore would be able to return to normal this summer, we are thankful that we are able to open and spend another wonderful summer together. We are working diligently to provide a quality program for your family given the ongoing pandemic. Please remember that plans could change at any moment and know that we will communicate that with you as soon as possible.

We are immensely grateful and honored that you entrust Camp Bayshore with your children.
