Bayshore Christian School 2021-22 COVID-19 Protocol



If student experiences Covid-19 symptoms:

Fever (100.4 F), chills, cough, shortness of breath, difficulty breathing, fatigue, abnormal muscle or body aches, headache, new loss of taste or smell, sore throat, congestion or runny nose, nausea or vomiting and diarrhea.



Students/Parents Will

- 1. Notify the school at 813-839-4297 and student and siblings need to stay home; if at school, student and siblings will be isolated and must be picked up within 30 minutes.
- 2. Student will need to have a Physician's note before student and siblings may return to school.



If Student Tests Positive

- Notify the school of results
- Student(s) testing positive/Sibling(s) must quarantine for 10 days from when a positive test is performed. Must remain asymptomatic for 72 hours before returning.
- The school will notify parents of classmates if quarantine is necessary.
- The school will Sanitize classroom.



If Student Tests Negative <u>OR</u> If Physician Does Not Order Test

- Notify the school of results
- Continue medical care as instructed
- Student/sibling may return to school with physician's clearance. A physician's note is required. (Paper, Email, Fax)
- If the student has a fever, the student may return to school after being fever-free for 24 hours without fever reducing medication.



If Student is Aware of Close Proximity with Someone who has tested positive for Covid-19



- Unmasked individuals with an exposure must quarantine for 10 days (without an option of virtual learning.)*
- Individuals exposed and masked do not need to quarantine but will be asked to continue to wear a mask for the 10-day quarantine period.
- Individuals unmasked and vaccinated (for those who wish to voluntarily share their vaccination status) must wear a mask for the 10day quarantine period but may come to school.
- Individuals who have had a positive COVID result within the last 3 months, and who have been exposed do not need to quarantine as long as they have fully recovered and remain symptom free; however, they will be asked to wear a mask during the 10-day quarantine period. Proof of a previous positive result will need to be provided and 3 months from that date will be noted.

*Virtual Learning

In order to provide the most streamlined, effective curriculum and instruction throughout the school year and because of the rapid nature of the transmission of the Delta variant, virtual learning is not available for students in quarantine.
