

# 2020 Kindergarten and Elementary Summer Reading Required Summer Reading for students who are entering grades K-5<sup>th</sup> Books can be found at the public library, book stores or online.

Research shows that summer reading is the key to retain and excel academic achievement. We encourage students to choose books they enjoy and read often.

Please give completed drawing, forms, or journals to your child's teachers by August 15, 2020. This will be part of first quarter reading grade.

## Each student entering -

<u>Kindergarten</u> – A parent or an adult reads 10 books to student. Help child learn 10 new words. Using a reading journal (spiral notebook) Students will write their name and draw a picture of what the story was about for each book. Parents may write the titles on the drawing.

1st grade- Student with parent or an adult read together with your child 15 books. Encourage your child to read independently on a beginner level or above. Use reading log form below on page 2 to submit titles read.

**2**nd **grade**- Students will independently read 15 books from any titles of their own choosing at a first grade level or above. Use reading log page 2, and Fun challenge gird form page 3.

<u>3rd grades</u>- Students will choose 2 chapter books from any title of their choosing at second or above grade level. Choose books that they have not read. Complete reading log page 2 and Fun challenge grid form page 4.

4th- 5th grades- 4th Grade students will read 3 chapter books of their choosing at third grade level of above. 5th Grade students will read 3 books from their grade level list, below. Choose books that they have not read. 4th and 5th grade students may choose to use the One Note from Morejon's Classroom or will keep a reading journal (ex. one-subject wide ruled spiral notebook) to record book titles, authors, number of pages, and written work. For each book you choose, answer questions in complete sentences using the "Summer Reading Journal" found below. Only if you chose a non-fiction book, write a summary (at least 2 paragraphs) of the book in your journal.
